

**Leadership Education and Training (LET) Courses:**

The Academy will offer JROTC first and second year (LET 1 & 2). The third year (LET 3) may be added if there is sufficient interest. All instruction is provided by fully certified US Army JROTC instructors.



**LET courses** provide a progressive leadership and citizenship development program that is recognized for its excellence by the United States Service Academies and the finest universities.

Cadets who return for successive summer programs will receive increased leadership opportunities and responsibilities. Qualified cadets who complete all four levels of LET may receive a nomination from Army and Navy Academy to one of the major Service Academies, or a recommendation for a College ROTC scholarship.

The LET credit received may be applied at Army and Navy Academy, at any other JROTC program, or as an elective credit at most high schools. (Students must confirm credit transferability with their current school).

For those attending the Army & Navy Academy in the fall, the summer training and testing allows cadets to receive full credit for their Plebe training and enter the Academy as a fully recognized cadet in the Corps of Cadets with full rights and privileges. These cadets will also enter with the advanced rank Of Private First Class (PFC.)

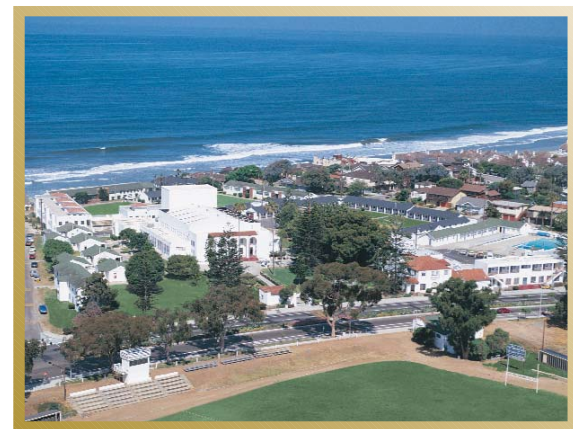

The Academy has a beautiful oceanfront setting in Carlsbad, California, approximately 35 miles north of San Diego and 80 miles south of Los Angeles.

### Our Facilities

Our campus facilities consist of 16.5 acres, including a gymnasium, cafeteria, library media center, recreation center, dormitories, swimming pool, tennis courts, athletic field, hockey rink, and private beach.



### Graduating Cadets will receive the following:

- A Graduation Certificate & Official Cadet Record attesting to the successful completion of a JROTC course
  - CPR and First-Aid Certification
  - Lifeguard Certification (for qualified cadets)
  - Scuba Certification\* (if available, additional costs apply)
  - Physical Education Credit\*
  - Health Credit\* (for cadets who complete LET 2)
  - Community Service Credit\*
  - Promotion to Private First Class (PFC) for completion of LET 1; or, the next higher rank for completion of LET 2. *(Promotions are given to cadets from other programs only with the concurrence of their Senior Army Instructor.)*
  - New Cadet "Plebe" Orientation Credit (For sophomore through senior cadets who will be attending Army & Navy Academy in fall)
- \* Credit transferability must be pre-approved by the student's current school. Scuba certification program will be offered only if minimum enrollment is met.

Safety and security are a priority at the Academy. We have security officers on duty 24-hours a day and surveillance cameras to monitor our campus and cadets at all times. Residential Life Officers oversee cadets and serve as a cadet's mentor/advisor. Cadets are housed in our double and triple room dormitories and cottages. Living in a boarding school environment allows cadets to socialize and build long-lasting friendships in a setting free of common external distractions. Cadets learn to cooperate and achieve organizational goals.
